Prepare

A voice cries: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." — Isaiah 40.3-5

As the church year resets, we begin again at the beginning. Advent starts the church calendar and sets the stage for what is to come. Advent is the season for preparation. We prepare, not only for the entire church year, but for the coming of the Christ. We know that Jesus has come, that first Christmas, so long ago, but the church year gives us time to celebrate all that Jesus has done for us.

We wait with eager expectation for the birth of the Christ He had promised to Adam and Eve in the garden. Through the generations that promise was confirmed again and again. Pick up a devotion book and begin going through. Make a habit to be in the word daily. No excuses, just do it. Make it a habit also to be in worship with your brothers and sisters in Christ.

Jesus encourages us to worship together in that Third Commandment. Jesus, Himself, was in worship on the Sabbath day (Mark 1.21, 1.39, 3.1, 6.2). The disciples, after Easter, understood the importance of worshipping also (Acts 2.42, 46). Don't distance yourself from receiving the gifts of God through Divine Service. Prepare, by being in the house of your Lord weekly. Let nothing take you away from receiving Jesus.

Prepare by encouraging those around you in Jesus. Isn't that what Isaiah's task was? Prepare the royal highway! Not just for himself but for the people of Israel. John the Baptizer also focused on those around him. He encouraged all to prepare for the coming of the Christ. So you also, encourage family and friends to be in Christ this Advent and continually.

Make these Advent preparations now. And don't stop. As the church year moves through Epiphany and into Lent continue in the habit of worship and studying the Word. Continue to be a blessing to those around you. Let nothing deter you from Jesus. Rejoice with us at Immanuel in all that Jesus has done for us. Let us be faithful, together, in Word and deed, that we all would receive the crown of eternal life.

Walmart Witnessing – Opportunities To Share Jesus

It has often been mentioned in Immanuel's Sunday Morning Adult Bible Class that "Walmart is the mission field!" How can we share Jesus with the "People of Walmart"? What are some witnessing ideas and strategies that one can use as we do our personal shopping at Walmart?

The first step in Walmart Witnessing is "Preparation". Even before you leave home, take time to pray that God may open up opportunities to share Jesus with others on your shopping trip. Be sure to have tracts or other Christian literature in your car, purse, or with you.

Upon arriving at the Walmart parking lot, take notice if there are people at the entrance holding up signs asking for money or food. If so, you may have two options. You could go inside and purchase some hot deli food, go back to your car, and drive back to the entrance to drop off the food. Or you could drive to a nearby McDonalds and purchase some food and drink for them. This would be a great opportunity to include a Christian tract with the food and a parting greeting "May Jesus Bless Your Dav!"

Once inside Walmart, practice friendly conversations with the greeters and people you meet as you do your shopping. You might be surprised at the opportunities that open up to share Jesus, especially with the checkout cashiers. Just saying "May Jesus Bless Your Day" could bring joy to their day!

Above all, use your shopping time to pray for the various people you see as you go down the aisles. (Yes, pray for the strangers that you pass by!) Take special notice of the mother with young children, the teenagers, the senior citizens and the physically challenged people on the electric carts. Be patient while waiting in the checkout line and let other people go ahead of you. Strive to engage in conversations (if possible) with other people waiting in the long checkout lines. (Opportunities for sharing Jesus may arise from such interactions.)

One "Random Act Of Kindness" that can have a powerful Gospel proclamation is

the use of the \$10 Walmart gift cards. Purchase a \$10 Walmart gift card and put it in a small envelope along with a simple Gospel tract. Label the envelope with the words "May You Be Blessed With This \$10 Walmart Gift Card! May Jesus Bless Your Day!" Then go past the checkout lines and look for someone waiting in line that you feel could use this gift. Ask them if they would like to accept your gift, and then go on your way. This simple act of kindness will most likely be talked about among their family and friends for a long time.

May you continue to look for opportunities to share Jesus with the people you encounter as you shop at today's mission field – Walmart!
