## Going Away... Sort Of

*Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. ~ John 16.7*

They were confused and bewildered. It seemed that nothing made sense in the world anymore. Their teacher, Jesus, was saying all these odd things about his death and resurrection. It just did not make sense to them. After three years with Jesus the disciples still did not understand. The events of Holy Week did not make things any clearer. As Jesus was arrested the disciples fled for fear that they would be jailed next. Even on Easter Sunday the disciples were still hiding in the upper room. Yet, Jesus appeared to them and spoke the good news of His resurrection. But what all this meant was still not clear to the disciples.

Not until after Jesus ascended into heaven did things make sense. Still it was not the disciples who understood of their own intellect, but the Helper had come to them. After Jesus ascended He sent the Spirit to the disciples on Pentecost and the disciples suddenly got it. They understood why Jesus had come to earth and they finally understood what His death on the cross meant for them and for all people. The disciples began preaching powerfully to the people from Pentecost on. What a miracle that they finally understood and what grace God gave them to understand!

They would not have understood without the Holy Spirit and they would not have received the Spirit had Jesus not ascended and given them the Spirit. It was indeed to their advantage that Jesus ascended and sent the Spirit or they would have been cowering in the upper room for much, much, longer. It is to your advantage also that Jesus has ascended. We may be tempted to think that if only Jesus would appear to us and do some miracle then we could believe in Him with our whole heart. Yet, Jesus has ascended, He is not here. Jesus has not left us alone. He has given us a Helper to teach us His Word and give us faith. This helper is the Holy Spirit.

This Spirit came to you through your Baptism. This Holy Spirit gave you faith to trust in Jesus as your Savior. This Spirit brought the saving death of Jesus to you in a real way so that your sins are forgiven and you are made a child of God. This is all to your advantage for the Spirit points you to your Savior Jesus.

Jesus has not gone away from you forever. He is still here. He was in your Baptism for you were baptized into His name. He is in the Lord's Supper for He says to you, "This is my body, this is my blood." He is there for you so that your sins would be forgiven. He is there whenever two or three are gathered in his name. He has not forsaken you. He was forsaken upon the cross so that you, his dear child, would never be forsaken. You need not be confused nor bewildered for you know with confidence that Jesus Christ is your Savior. He has died upon the cross and forgives you all your sins. Through your baptism He brought salvation unto you.

Jesus ascended into heaven bodily. Yet, He sent his Spirit, the Helper, to the disciples and to you also. You are not alone in this difficult world. That Helper is in you for your baptized body is his temple. He is waiting for you in the Word of God to strengthen your faith. He is ready to direct you to your Savior's body and blood given and shed for you. That Spirit is ready to point you to the suffering and death of your Savior, Jesus, so that you would never be confused nor afraid.

## **G.L.U.E** **“God Loves Us Eternally”**

Last year the Stewardship Board introduced the “Red Letter Challenge.” Again this year the board introduced another challenge...“Being!”(1) It is the first of the five main principles introduced last year.

Being has five “Keystone Habits”; Community, Scripture, Prayer, Solitude and Church.

**Community**---the community we’re talking about here is our “Church Community”. We also have other communities and relationships, sometimes settling for “fake, inauthentic, cyber relationships.” But, our main relationship is with God. “People who are connected in Christian community tend to walk closely with Christ throughout their lives.” The “Being” challenge wants to know who your community is. Who is in your inner circle? Are they real or fake? Being in a relationship with God is the “real” community. We have other earthly relationships, too, which are fine. But we need to ensure that they are authentic.

**Scripture**---“Read it, research it, remember it, reflect on it.” One way to do this is to follow a plan. I have not read the Bible completely. I am now on a daily reading plan. It helps. Even if you fall behind, don’t be discouraged. Once I started reading, I found it to be like reading a novel. “We find who God is and who we are when studying Scripture.” Our “true meaning comes only when our identity is rooted firmly in Christ.” “The Bible contains truth. Timeless truth.” It is the inspired Word of God. It transforms us. Be willing to share it with others.

**Prayer**---gives us direction in a confusing world. In prayer direction comes from God. How often do you pray, daily, weekly, monthly, only when you think you need something? “Prayer ought to be the first response, not the last resort.” Do you prioritize prayer to be first? The Lord’s Prayer, daily, is a good place to start. Set up a time to pray, morning and evening and when needed. “It’s not important how you pray, but that you pray.” It is the best tool we have for communication with God. He will answer. And, don’t forget to praise God in prayer also.

**Solitude**---isn’t about being alone in this sense. It’s about being alone with God. How much time do you spend with God. “Jesus got away so that He could be alone with God.” For a relationship with God we must spend time with Him, alone...just us and Him. Do you seek time alone with God? We must have God in our hearts or bad things can take God’s place...distractions can take the place of God. When you wake up in the morning, is the first thing you do is grab your phone to see who contacted you, or read the news or check your email? The first thing you should do is pray, contact God about anything. “Without focus, we can’t be consistently productive. Our distractions draw us away from important things. The key is learning how to live with all of the distractions, and yet stay focused on the task God has given us. The key is having more of God, not more of you. Solitude is the fertilizer that produces more fruit. There is a limit on what you can do on your own, but there is no limit on what God can do.” The key is focusing on abiding in God, not doubling down on your own strength. An important part of solitude is meditating with God.

**Church**---is here for the choosing. Going to church consistently is the “ultimate key to success”. “Consistency matters.” It is so easy to be inconsistent because of all of the distractions in our lives. It is where we go to pray, to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord’s Supper. The real purpose of the church “is to bring glory to God”. “The church is a living organism called, the body of Christ. The aim of the church is to be a hospital for sinners, not a hotel for saints.” We are all flawed. Christians should not think they are better than others because they go to church. We are all sinners and need the Grace of God through forgiveness given to us by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. “Trust God fully and trust Christians wisely.” God can be trusted fully and He invites us to join Him in church.

Another great program for Christians in my opinion. Thanks to Lynette Walz, Ursula Gangler and the Stewardship Board for providing this “challenge” to us again this year. Keeping these Keystone Habits will keep us focused on God in spite of all of the distractions encountered in life.

### **Ephesians 2:8-9**

For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Do you want Immanuel Lutheran Church to thrive long into the future? Do you want to help see that it does? You can!

Have you heard about Immanuel's Endowment and Capital Fund? The Fund Committee would like you to know that there are ways you can ensure that Immanuel lasts well into the future with your help.

When you think about all the wonderful things that God has done for you, have you thought about what you can do to keep God's Word flowing at Immanuel?

One sure way is to donate to the Endowment and Capital Fund through your estates. The Fund can receive stocks, bonds, real estate, cash and personal property. These can all be donated from your, or your loved one's estates. Be sure to designate "Endowment and Capital Fund" with your donation.

The Fund was established in 1995 to ensure that funds are available for church capital projects approved by the Fund Committee and the Church Council. The committee receives recommendations from the congregation, boards and committees for viable capital projects. The fund capital is protected by the Capital Fund bylaws and cannot be used for any other purpose. When projects are approved for the use of principal from the fund, there are spending and time limits governing future withdrawals from the fund, thus allowing the Fund to continue growing into the future.

Your donations are protected by the Fund's restricted or unrestricted clauses which state that either principal and interest can be used for church capital

projects, or only the interest. Using only the interest keeps your original donation in the fund. You can decide which is best for the church at the time of your donation.

The goal is for the Fund to continue growing each year through donations and interest growth from the Fund's investments, currently with Thrivent, and monitored closely by the Fund Committee to ensure the rate of return expected by the committee.

Feel free to talk to any member of the Endowment Committee to answer all of your questions. Current officers of the committee are, Jim Bratton, Troy Strieter and Gary Wissner.

With continued support for the Fund, Immanuel's future is solidified thanks to Immanuel members like you! God has blessed Immanuel throughout the years with His Word and Sacrament. By His Grace it will continue long into the future!

It's hard to believe that May is here already and this current school year is coming to a close. Field Day is Friday, May 26 and for the first time since I've been at CTK, all of our students, Preschool through 8th grade, will celebrate field day together on the Sebewaing campus. Graduation day for our 13, 8th graders is May 31. These students have worked hard and are well prepared to start high school in the fall. Closing chapel and awards is the morning of June 2. This is the last day of the school year and summer vacation begins. Where does the time go?

While this year is wrapping up, we are already looking towards the next school year. Re-enrollment and Summer Camp registration are in full swing. Books and materials are being ordered including five interactive whiteboards (thanks to

the auction!) for classroom use. There will be several physical changes to both buildings this summer too which includes new windows and doors, and playground upgrades.

Christ the King Lutheran School offers a quality, Christian education. We continue to spread the good news of CTK to the community. Social media posts and newspaper ads and articles share upcoming events as well as accomplishments. The Board of Education has spent a great deal of time reviewing staffing, enrollment and finances and is working on a plan to further promote CTK, including visiting local churches and organizations and being active in the community with the hope of increasing enrollment. Tuition for the 2023-2024 school year is staying the same as last year for the first child in a family, but has actually been reduced for families with multiple children at CTK. The Board has also instituted a tuition reduction for referring new families to CTK all in the hopes of growing enrollment.

We fervently ask for your prayers and support at CTK. Your love of your school was evident with the amazing success of the auction this spring. \$87,649.16 was raised that evening with 10% of that going towards the scholarship fund to help those families who need additional support.

We welcome conversations about the budget, staffing, curriculum, etc. and encourage you to stop in or give us a call to help you better understand what is happening. Our primary mission at CTK is "Bring in, Build up, and Send out" disciples for Christ and we can do that with your prayers and support.
