Faithful to God's Word – we receive, celebrate and share Jesus Christ.

Come, Lord Jesus!

Jesus said, "And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not alarmed, for this must take place, but the end is not yet." (Matthew 24.6)

For the apostles of Jesus it felt like the end was very near. There were wars and rumors of wars all over the Roman Empire. Their city, Jerusalem, was destroyed by Rome in 70 AD, just a few decades after Jesus died and rose again. There was also a 'great persecution' against the church (Acts 8.1) during the time of the apostles. Surely, Jesus must be coming soon.

They waited for Jesus. They proclaimed His Word and received His gifts through the Divine Service. They waited. Jesus did not disappoint them. He did not come back a second time in their lifetimes, but He did not disappoint. He had mercy on the church, that little group of believers, and gathered more around His means of grace. He forgave sins and granted life eternal.

Things didn't change much for the church over the millennia. Still there were and are rumors of wars around the globe. Still there was persecution of Christians. Still Christ gathered the faithful around His means of grace. With John, Christians continued to pray, "Come, Lord Jesus (Revelation 22.20)." It was expected, in every age, that Christ would come back soon.

But He is in control. Jesus comes back when He wants- in His time. Nothing holds Him back, He is God. Things are bad enough, have been bad enough, that He could come back and end this world at any time. He will come back, like a thief in the night (Matthew 24.43) and every eye will see Him (Revelation 1.7).

So what should we do? Are there not wars and rumors of war in our time? How about disasters? Are things (in about every respect) getting worse? Jesus reminds us to "stay awake (Matthew 24.42)." So we do. We remain awake in Him who died for us. This means that we continue to hear His Word and receive Him in the Supper. We continue to live in the grace given us through our Baptism into Him. He has drown our sins and granted us life eternal.

Jesus is in control. Did He not order the rise and fall of nations throughout the Old Testament for His purposes? Of course! He was in control. He raised up rulers and nations for His reasons. He remains in control today. Nothing happens that He does not permit. The church might still look small and insignificant to the world. It might still look like a faintly burning wick about to be snuffed out. But Jesus walks with us. He is in control although it might be difficult to see from inside this tribulation.

We join our voices to the eternal Te Deum each time we meet for Divine Service. Heaven breaks in on earth, as it did for John in Revelation. The church is still ready and awake. We know that Jesus is in control. He has forgiven our sins. He loves us. He will not forsake us. "Fear not," Jesus says, "I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of death and hades (Revelation 1.17-18)." He could come back at any time, the earth is bad enough. It's always been bad enough. But Jesus is good, better than we deserve. He loves you and shall bring you out of this tribulation.
