Rejected?

I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! For I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin. Romans 11.1

Paul seems so sure of himself. He says that God has not rejected his people, stating this emphatically. But what evidence is Paul pointing to? The fact that he has descended from the tribe of Benjamin? That is nice but surely there are many, at that time who could trace their ancestry from Abraham, but were rejected by God. When the Jews were debating with Jesus in John 8, they said, "Abraham is our father." Just like Paul they pointed to their genealogy. From Abraham came the people of Israel. And the Jews claimed that they were part of this great heritage. Yet, those Jews were not doing what their father Abraham did. Abraham looked earnestly for the promises of God. Abraham followed the commandments of the Lord even when those commandments seemed self-contradictory. Like when God promised Abraham and all the world would be blessed through Abraham's descendant, then God told Abraham to go and kill his only son. And Abraham obeyed, believing and simply trusting God that somehow God had a plan. But is genealogy enough? Paul seems to say that God has not rejected his people and he points to the fact that he is a Benjamite.

To look at the state of Israel during the time of Paul one might wonder if the Jews were rejected by God. After all they had persecuted the Son of God. After claiming that they were children of Abraham (in John 8) the Jews picked up stones to stone Jesus. Not exactly something faithful people might do. Even still the Jews handed over the Son of God to the Romans and demanded that Jesus be crucified. Again, not something faithful people would do. And in the time of Paul, the Jews seemed to be hindering the spread of the Good News. At Iconium the Jews stirred up the Gentiles to persecute Paul, even trying to stone him. These Jews followed Paul to Lystra and there they did stone him (Ac 14). In Philippi Paul was imprisoned by the Jews for casting out a demon from a young girl (Ac 16). At Thessalonica the Jews were jealous of Paul and the following he was winning for the Gospel. It seemed that at every turn the children of Israel were hindering the spread of the Gospel among the Gentiles. How could God not reject these people who were actively working against His plans and His purpose?

God did not reject Paul. Paul, then Saul, had been working against God and against God's plan. Paul was zealous for the faith, but he had the wrong zeal for the wrong faith. He was actively persecuting the followers of Jesus, placing them in jail and breathing murderous threats against them. On the way to Damascus, where Paul planned on persecuting Christians, Jesus appeared to him and changed his life. On that road Paul was told he was persecuting God. Paul went from being an enemy of the church to a missionary to the Gentiles. Paul could point to himself as proof that God had not rejected his people. But no doubt that was little comfort for the average Christian. As persecution came upon the church, as people fell away, as it seemed like the church was about to be crushed it appeared that God has rejected his people.

And since the time of Paul what has changed? The church seems to be dwindling. The membership counts of our churches have gone down drastically in the last decades. The church may not seem as prosperous as it was in generations past. As Lutheran churches and school close their doors it seems that God has rejected his people. As the culture becomes less and less Christian and this nation seems to be falling away from the faith it is difficult to think that God has not rejected his people.

But even closer to home. As families fall apart, as children make wrong choices in life, and as we fall into sin it seems that God has rejected us. Just look at your own life. When difficult times fall upon us we wonder where God's love is, has God rejected us? When a loved one dies, when health problems come upon us, or when life simply does not go the way we expect we wonder if God has turned his back on us. Even as we pray, and pray and there seems to be no answer we wonder if God is even listening to us. Does God not care that we suffer?

Does God not care that we are nearly crushed by the cares of this world? Does God not hear us when we cry to him? Has God rejected us? As we look around it is easy to think God has rejected us.

But be honest, don't we deserve God to reject us? What have we done that is so wonderful that would make God not reject us? Does God need the best of our deeds? No, he has no need of them? Does God need our money? No, God needs no money. Does God need our love and devotion? No, God has no need of these either. There is nothing we can do that would change our rejected fate. As we reject God in sin there is nothing we can do to change our unfortunate condition.

I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! How can we know that God has not rejected us? Well, we must turn away from ourselves and our sins. See not what you have done, but what God has done for you. Turn your gaze to the cross and see what Jesus has done for you. He took upon himself all your sin. All the times you rejected him and he became rejected to death for you. Although you had nothing to offer God, Jesus offered you his sacrificial death. More than that, he brought his death to you for you would never come to him on your own. How do you know that you are not rejected by God, first see Jesus dying for you. Second, see how this death comes to you, turn to your baptism. There at the font you were joined to the death that Jesus died. There at the font you were forgiven. Jesus entered your life and proved his love of you. There you were made, not a child of Abraham, but a child of God. This gift of God is irrevocable. It is sure and it is powerful. Your baptism avails for you even this day. The forgiveness given to you that day is the forgiveness you have this day. You were not rejected by God but you have been shown just how deeply God loves you.

Further proof of this is found in the Supper. There Jesus joins his body and blood to simple bread and wine and gives these to you. Here, much like baptism, you are joined to the death of Jesus. For it is his body which was broken for you upon the cross which you eat; and it is his blood shed for you which you drink. And as you eat and drink, you trust that God has not rejected you for you take Jesus at his word that this Supper is for the forgiveness of your sins. As you eat you are forgiven. There can be no doubt that the people of God have not been rejected! For you yourself have been joined to the death of Jesus through baptism. And you are given his body and blood Sunday after Sunday. You are a child of God, adopted through the blood of God himself!

In every age a Christians can look around themselves and find plenty of evidence in their lives and the world around them that seem to show God has rejected his people. The devil himself presents us with this evidence to shake our confidence and take our eyes off what our Lord has done for you. Thus, know for certain that God has not rejected his people and he has not rejected you! Even though you suffer and although your life may be wrought with difficulty you are still loved by God. See the evidence! Look to the cross, remember your baptism, and come to the Supper. There is all the evidence that you need to see that God still loves you. There is proof that you are a child of God. Although in sin God should reject us, the Father has sent his Son, Jesus. Jesus has given his life to save you. Fear not, for you are saved and are a child of God. God has not rejected you!

As we know, the New Testament Gospel is the Story of Jesus' life and teachings, as well as, what is to come.

As I read the Bible I find it much like reading a book of short stories bringing me closer to understanding God's Word and the life of Jesus and His love for us.

Please continue to keep CTK in your prayers this school year!




